	Federal and state tax filings (e.g., 941, 940, W-2, W-3)
	Documentation of Federal ID Number
Payroll -Based Figures	
	Federal 941 or State Unemployment Quarterly Reports with employee job titles and/or work performed
	Regular and overtime wages (separated)
Cost-Based Figures	
	Total cost of labor, materials and equipment furnished, used, or delivered
	General Liability certificates of insurance for all subcontractors who performed work during the policy period. The certificates must show coverage for the entire time the subcontractor performed work for the insured.
Sales-Based Figures	
	Income statement for the policy period showing total gross sales
	Quarterly sales tax reports for the policy period
	Federal 1 120 report for the policy period which shows the total gross sales
	Profit and loss statement
Additional Documents (if applicable)	
	Contracts and agreements with clients and subcontractors
	Records of any claims or incidents during the policy period
